Societies


Here you can find groups focused around a shared interest, an academic focus, a political or otherwise shared identity aspect, or non-sporting activity like board games, arts, and local history.

STUDENT NETWORKS

Looking for a safe space to make friends and find support? Our Student Networks are the place to be if you want to meet other students with similar experiences. Networks are permanent student groups, with protected or underrepresented identity aspects that can impact their student experience. These groups are facilitated by staff from your Students' Association and focus on providing safe spaces for students to share experiences, plan activities, and advocate for their needs.

The following networks are open to any who self-identify.

The Pride Network - for LGBTO+ individuals and allies.

The Women's Network - for those who self-define as women, including (if they wish) those with complex gender identities which include 'woman', and those who experience oppression as women.

The Accessibility Network – for disabled students and those with access and support considerations.

The Students of Colour Network - for students who may experience discrimination due to racial or ethnic difference.

The Neurodiversity Network - for student who self-define as nonneurotypical.

The Digital Network- for online and networked students.

The International Network - for students from other places in the world: distance learners or those new to Scotland!

Who We Are & What We Do

The Advice Service is a free, confidential and impartial service that offers assistance to all UHI students. We can help with academic issues and direct you to relevant services for other support. Our goal is to provide you with the resources and guidance you need to make the most of your student experience.

We advise current students, whether on campus or remote, undergraduate or postgraduate (teaching or research), UK or International. We also advise graduates who are still involved in university processes, including appeals and complaints.

How Can the Service Help Students?

INDEPENDENT AND IMPARTIAL


We are part of the Students' Association, which allows us to act independently and support students who are in dispute with the university or who need impartial advice.

UNIQUELY TAILORED ADVICE

Our caseworkers are specially trained to provide trauma-informed, nonjudgmental guidance to you. They have extensive knowledge of funding policies and participate in regular training to stay up-to-date. They are actively involved in policy development within the university and hold positions on various university committees and working groups.

CONFIDENTIAL

We have a strict confidentiality policy, so you can rest assured that your information won't be shared with the Academic Partner without your explicit permission.



We Specialise in Providing Advice on Key Topics

ACADEMIC

Appeals, misconduct, student code of conduct investigations, complaints, mitigating circumstances, support for study, fitness to practice, etc.

MONEY

Student hardship and discretionary funds, bills, budgeting, council tax, banking, and discounts.

HOUSING

Support in how to find accommodation, university halls disciplinary procedures, checking tenancies, unfair terms, evictions, ending tenancies, deposits, repairs, rent, first-tier tribunal cases, homelessness, etc.

Exceptions

We cannot advise on immigration. We do not have a licence for this type of advice and refer all immigration enquiries to the University immigration advice team or external organisations.


