Automatic and Free Membership

They work together as a team, but each of them focuses on individual and local College remits to represent you and drive forward your interests. - Complete Student Surveys.


Sport Clubs, Societies & Student Networks

HISA ADVICE SERVICE

Who We Are & What We Do

The Advice Service is a free, confidential, and impartial support service available to all UHI students. We provide guidance on academic matters, housing, and student finance, and can signpost you to other services for additional support. Our aim is to equip you with the information and resources you need to get the most out of your student experience.

We support all current students—on campus or studying remotely; undergraduate or postgraduate, including both taught and research students; UK-based or international. We also advise recent graduates who are still engaged in university processes such as appeals or complaints.

How Can the Service Help Students?

INDEPENDENT AND IMPARTIAL


We are part of the Students' Association, which allows us to act independently and support students who are in dispute with the university or who need impartial advice.

UNIQUELY TAILORED ADVICE

Our caseworkers are specially trained to provide trauma-informed, nonjudgmental guidance to you. They have extensive knowledge of funding policies and participate in regular training to stay up to date. They are actively involved in policy development within the university and hold positions on various university committees and working groups.

CONFIDENTIAL

We have a strict confidentiality policy, so you can rest assured that your information won't be shared with the Academic Partner without your explicit permission.



We Specialise in Providing Advice on Key Topics

ACADEMIC

Appeals, misconduct, student code of conduct investigations, complaints, mitigating circumstances, support for study, fitness to practice, etc.

MONEY

Student hardship and discretionary funds, bills, budgeting, council tax, banking, and discounts.

HOUSING

Support in how to find accommodation, university halls disciplinary procedures, checking tenancies, unfair terms, evictions, ending tenancies, deposits, repairs, rent, first-tier tribunal cases, homelessness, etc.

Please note the following limitations of our service:

- We cannot provide immigration advice. We are not licensed to offer immigration advice and will refer all immigration-related enquiries to the University's International Support Team or appropriate external organisations.
- We do not offer mental health support. While we are not a mental health service
 and cannot provide direct therapeutic support, we can assist you in a crisis by
 signposting you to appropriate services. Our role is to offer practical advice and
 guidance.
