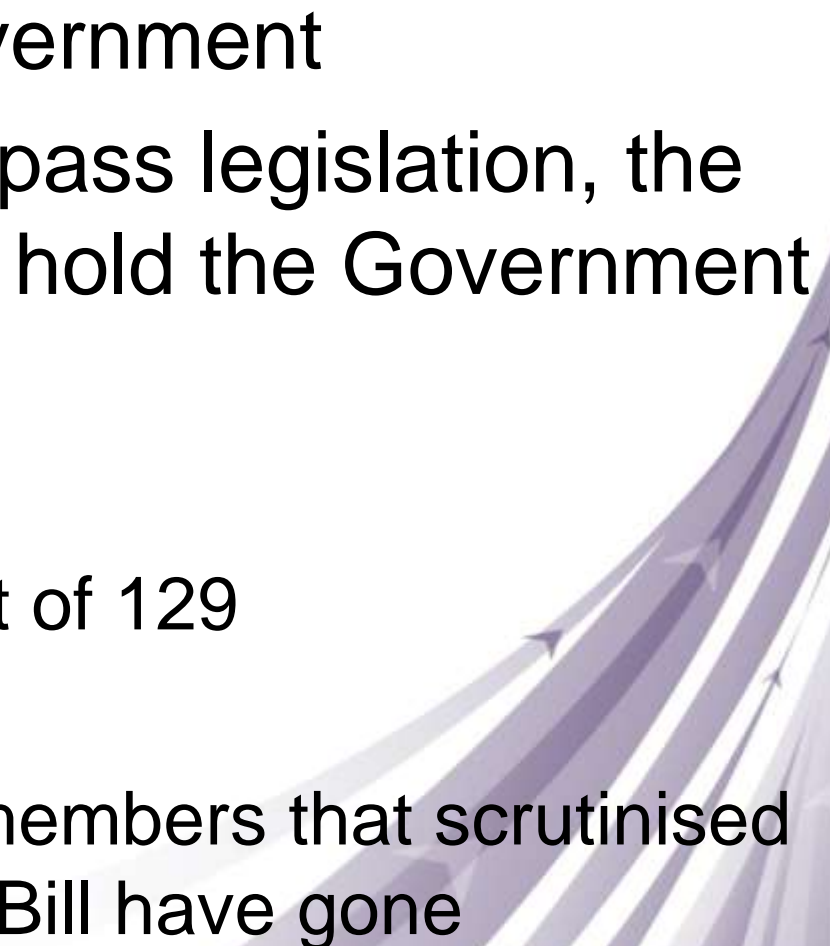




Purpose of the day

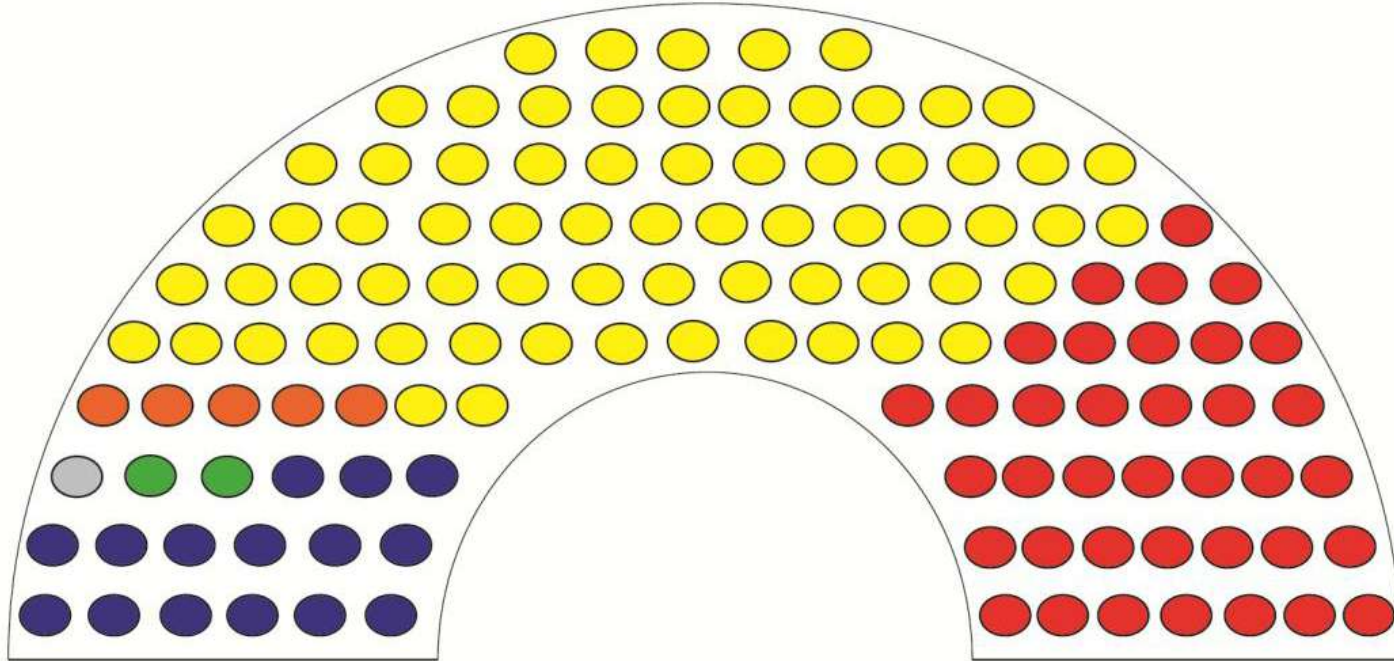
- To bring together climate change research networks in Scotland

 - SNP majority
 - Half the committee members that scrutinised the Climate Change Bill have gone

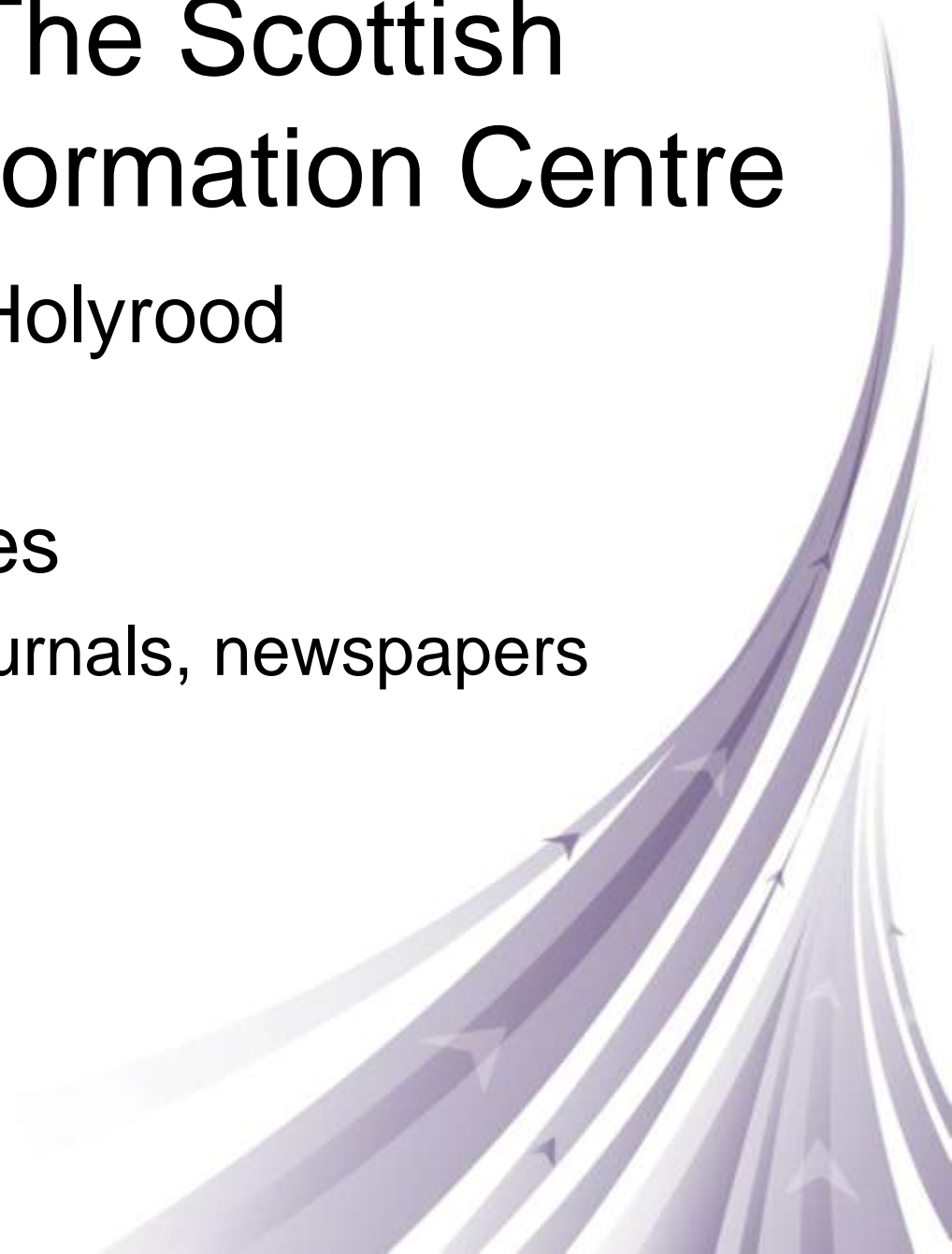

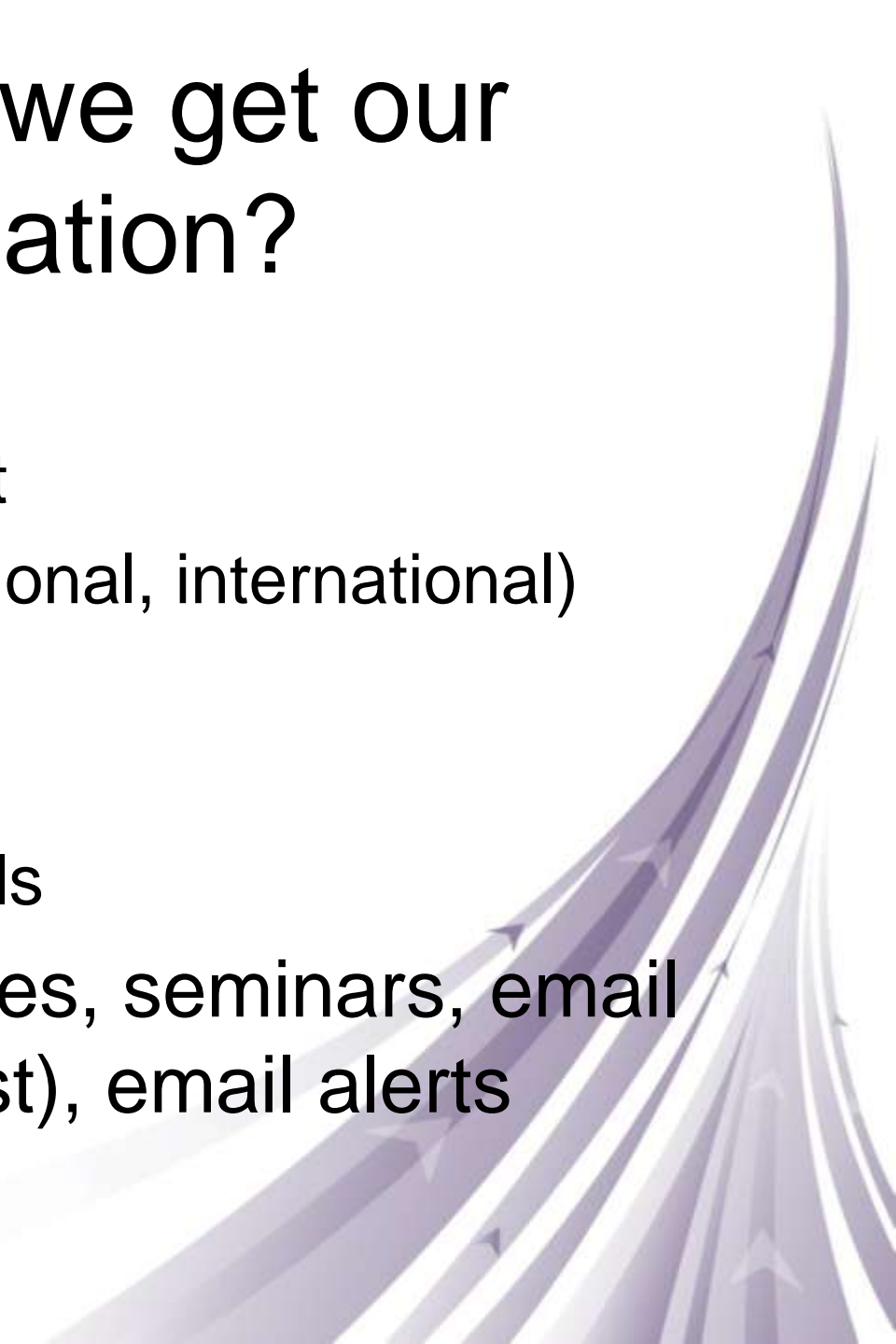
